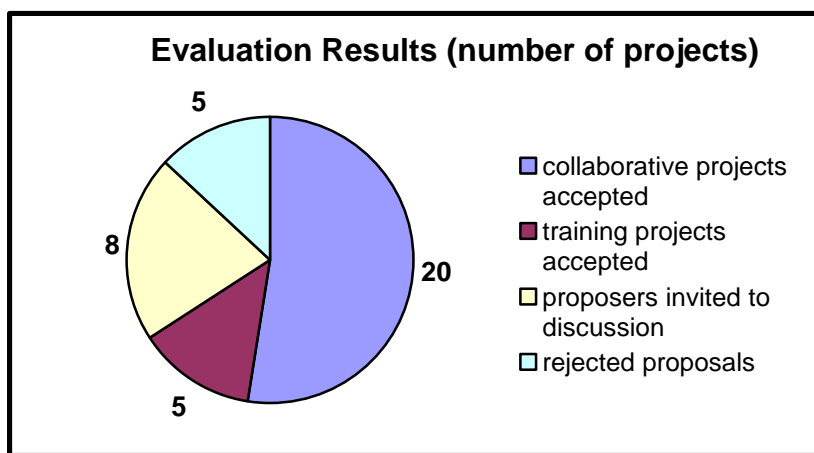




## Spring 2008 ETSF Call Statistics

The second deadline for submission to the ETSF call for proposals was 21 April 2008. **40 proposals** were submitted, amongst which 2 were submitted after the deadline and hence not evaluated. For the first time, proposals were evaluated by an independent panel of experts.

The 38 proposals evaluated came from 36 different proposers and institutions, involving 124 researchers. 25 proposals were fully or partly accepted, and 13 were unsuccessful (**69% of success**).



### ***Theoreticians or experimentalists?***

- 2/3 of the proposers were experimentalists
- 1/3 of the proposers were theoreticians

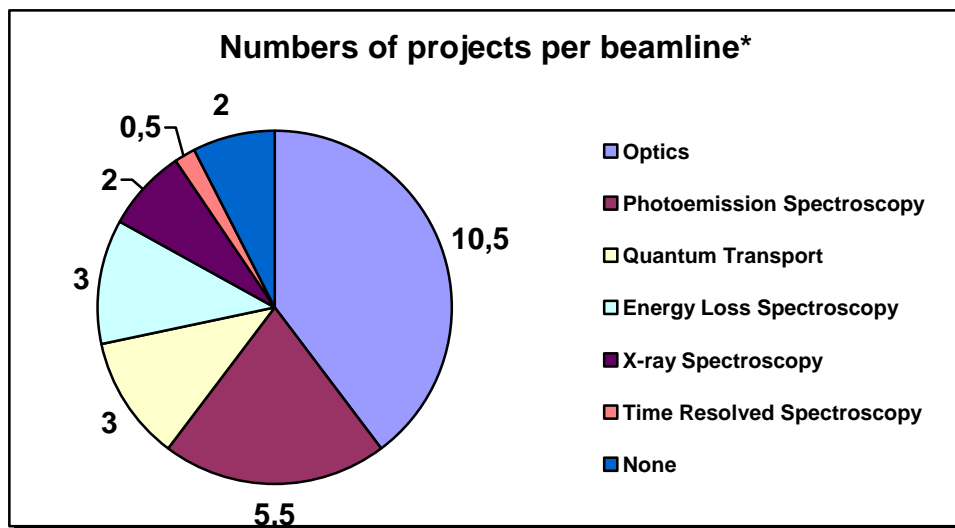
### ***Public or private sector?***

- 2 proposals came from the private sector: a big company and an SME (5% of the proposals)
- both projects have been accepted

## Domain of research/applications

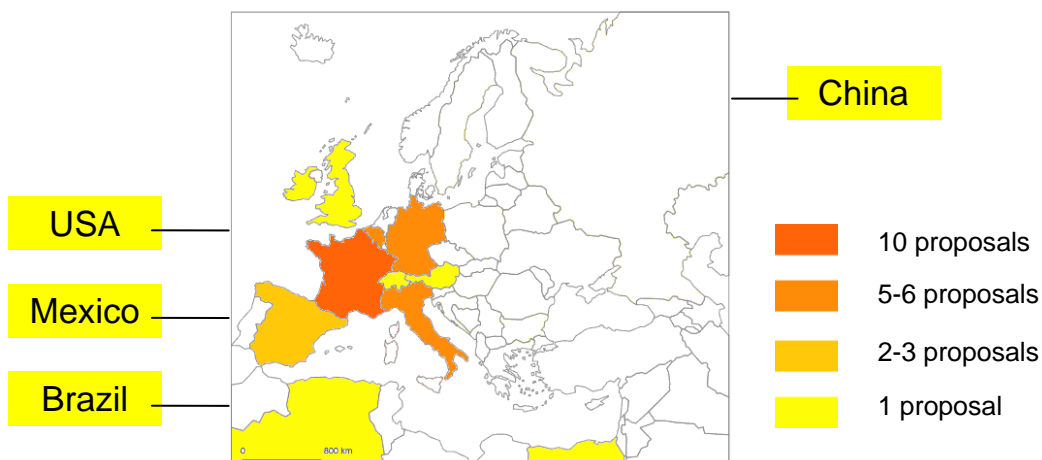
- Nanosciences (9): nanotechnology (6), physics – quantum dots, nanophysics, nanotechnology/surfaces
- Material science (10): material science (4), mineralogy, chemistry, physics – materials, chemistry – materials, materials/optics, physics/photovoltaics
- Physics (9): physics (3), astrophysics, biophysics, surface sciences, photoemission, physics-spectroscopy, electromicroscopy
